Buffalo is New York's second largest city, the center of a metropolitan population of about 293,000. It is situated in Western New York State, located at the eastern end of Lake Erie, 12 miles from the world-famous Niagara Falls.



Local attractions include a theater district, numerous museums, a variety of restaurants and numerous cultural events. During the summer, Buffalonians enjoy outdoor activities such as biking, hiking, boating, golf and free concerts in downtown's Lafayette Square, jazz on the steps of the Albright-Knox Art Gallery and Shakespeare in the Park .



There is also year round nightlife highlighted by the local music scene and professional sports featuring the NFL's Bills and the NHL's Sabres.

Buffalo is located within driving distance of tourist attractions in Toronto, Niagara Falls, Niagara-on-the Lake and the beautiful Finger Lakes region. Buffalo's weather is moderated by the lakes which provide cool, pleasant summers and actually have a warming effect in the winter. The lake is also responsible for much of the snow that gives the region its wintry reputation and optimal skiing conditions.

Numerous ski resorts are located within an hour's drive from downtown Buffalo.



A flagship institution in the State University of New York system, UB is the largest and most comprehensive campus in the 64-campus SUNY system. It is a member of the Association of American Universities.

UB ranks second among the country's public research universities, and 17th among American colleges and universities, in percentage of international enrollment. Nearly 12 percent of UB students study abroad— five times the national average. UB has exchange programs with 70 universities around the world.



The School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences is located on the North Campus, in a modern complex that provides ample, pleasant and well-equipped laboratory space and computing facilities for the school's research efforts. Major clinical and research collaboration exists between the faculty of the Schools of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences and Medicine and Biomedical Sciences.
