Jericho Road Community Health Center is a federally qualified health center comprised of multiple locations strategically located on the west side to meet the need of some of the most vulnerable patients in the city of Buffalo. Jericho Road Community Health Center provides high-quality medical care for people with limited access to medical care, like families living in poverty, refugees, and immigrants regardless of insurance status or patient ability to pay. Pharmacy service plays an integral part in the care delivered at Jericho Road. The center has two in-house dispensing pharmacies and a clinical pharmacotherapy service.

Goals

- To collaborate within an interprofessional healthcare team through active participation in the management of common chronic disease states encountered in the primary care setting
- To hone clinical knowledge and develop skills necessary for independent and collaborative practice
- To enhance communication and collaborative skills with patients and the healthcare team
- To form culturally competent, knowledgeable, and well-rounded pharmacists ready to be part of an integrated ambulatory care practice

Objectives

Upon completion of this experience, student pharmacists should be able to complete the following:

- Identify and interpret key subjective and objective data pertinent for common chronic diseases
- Assess subjective and objective data to identify possible non-pharmacologic and pharmacologic interventions utilizing evidence-based medicine and culturally appropriate care
- Communicate, verbally or in writing, interventions for common disease states seen in primary care
 - Document in a concise yet complete manner key health information, intervention, and recommendations in a note format
 - o Present patient case and care plan to preceptor, peers, and providers
- Lead pharmacotherapy visits
 - o Perform data collection and analysis for patient visit (work-up, medication reconciliation, problem identification, list of actionable items)

- Conduct visit and make interventions as clinically appropriate
- Document in EHR, complete pending tasks to complete visit, and follow-up as applicable
- Collaborate with members of care team and leverage expertise to positively impact care delivery and learning environment
- Recognize the role pharmacists, 340B pharmacy operations and FQHC designation in enhancing access to care
