The University at Buffalo (UB) School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences (SPPS) is proud of its long-standing tradition of graduating clinically competent Doctor of Pharmacy students. Our four-year, in-person PharmD program is ranked #1 in New York State and #19 nationally. This letter provides context for our curriculum and grading system to support your review of our graduates. The Class of 2026 includes 107 student pharmacists. While our Honors (H), Satisfactory (S), and Unsatisfactory (U) grading system may differ from traditional models, UB SPPS consistently achieves the highest NAPLEX pass rates in New York State (among eight schools).

Curriculum Overview

Our curriculum emphasizes academic excellence, professional development, and personal growth. Students participate in nationally recognized interprofessional education (IPE) and complete Objective Structured Clinical Exams (OSCEs) to assess APPE-readiness.

Grading System

All PharmD courses use the H/S/U scale:

- **H (Honors):** Grade of **90% or higher**
- S (Satisfactory): Grade between 70% and 89%
- U (Unsatisfactory): Grade of 69% or lower

Course percentages are then averaged to calculate a CAP (cumulative average percent). CAP is a straight average of all required course final percentages. CAP is not weighted by course credit hours.

Student Engagement

Each student joins a Learning and Engagement Community (LEC) led by faculty advisors. With 25 professional organizations and a robust co-curriculum, students explore interests, develop leadership skills, and contribute to the profession.
