



The Doctor of Pharmacy Curriculum at the University at Buffalo School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences is designed to prepare students to be “practice ready” upon graduation and act as caring, ethical, respectful, and scholarly pharmacy practitioners while serving as leaders in the advancement of the pharmacy profession.

The curriculum is intended to be a rigorous program of study providing the highest quality pharmacy education. At the cornerstone of our curriculum is the Pharmacists’ Patient Care Process based upon a strong foundation in the biomedical, pharmaceutical, clinical, and social/behavioral/administrative sciences, emphasizing the scholarly use of evidence-based medicine as a part of an interdisciplinary healthcare team to improve patient outcomes and quality of life. The curriculum incorporates a strong scientific knowledge relevant to contemporary pharmacy practice, and experiential and interprofessional education programs that span all four professional years. Our curriculum uniquely integrates pharmacokinetic, pharmacodynamic, and pharmacogenomic principles and educates future graduates in emerging areas of pharmacy. This places our graduates on the cutting edge of pharmacy practice and leaves our graduates well-positioned for a variety of pharmacy careers where their educational background and experiences will be utilized.
